

Crime Scene Initial Response & Management

Theory and practices in the Initial Response to a Crime/Death Scene is to include “real life experiences”. Upon the completion of this course, the student will be able to relate the application of procedures and responsibilities of assorted units, agencies, and bureaus conducting the investigation. These topics include: the initial response to the scene; securing the scene; access control; communications; identify witnesses, briefing of arriving personnel, documentation and working together with other agencies. Students will have two short group practical lab exercises and one group presentation. A written test will conclude the course and evaluate what they have learned. Students should expect some graphic images in the course presentation.
