The program will be conducted virtually while appropriate, and mentors and mentees can decide on their own face to face meetings.

EXPECTATIONS

All Mentees are required to demonstrate their commitment to the program and respect of their Mentor's time by:

- Communicate efficiently and be prepared for your meeting.
- Meet with Mentor as scheduled or communicate within their terms of rescheduling.
- Meet with SSS for periodic check-ins on progress.
- Attend the Virtual Information Session and Introduction and Meet and Greet- TBA 2021.
- Participate with scheduled activities with Mentor and the Grant team.
- Participate in an Exit Interview Survey.

EMAIL OF INTEREST

An email of interest will go out to all Information Security program students. If interested please reply promptly with the following:

COMPLETE THE SURVEY QUESTIONNAIRE

A brief questionnaire will be attached to the email with a few questions to introduce yourself to your mentor and what you hope you to get out of this program. You can also attach a copy of an updated resume if you have one available.

COMPLETE THE ONE PARAGRAPH COMPONENT

In a few brief sentences, tell us about your experience with cybersecurity, why you want to be in the field, and, if applicable, where you would like your focus to be. If you are still unsure, you can include that as well. This is to help us pair you with your mentor and to give your mentor an idea of what can help you best.
