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
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Job Simulator?




A job simulator is a virtual work experience. It provides hypothetical projects to students in order to get a sense of the job. These programs are self-guided and can be completed at your own pace. The purpose is to explore industries, test out the waters of the job, and start gaining experience.

Job simulators are found online through platforms, such as LinkedIn Learning. This service includes job simulators in business, arts, and technology. While a great resource, it has a membership fee. NCC's Careers office recommends students to use Forage instead.



Forage is a job simulator platform that is FREE for students! These virtual learning experiences are created by leading companies, including Visa, Lyft, Red Bull, and more! These programs are to simulate the real-world experience of that particular position. They're designed with the student in mind. This means the projects are entry-level, provides resources throughout the program, and is risk-free.

Participants will receive a certificate from the company upon completing a project. The participant will not be compensated or offer any type of employment opportunities. These experiences are purely just to practice potential projects, tasks, and responsibilities of that position. Forage does provide guidance on how to include these experiences in a resume.

Exploration

These job simulators are a great resource for students who are trying to decide which career path to pursue, or even which specific area within an industry. For example, there are many opportunities for a business student, ranging from human resources to marketing to finance



Confidence

You will gain a better understanding of the industry and gain confidence in specific tasks. These programs provide firsthand experience which can provide a better understanding of the job at head beyond what the classroom can teach. This can help you prepare for an internship or an entry level position.



Adding Experience

You can certainly add a job simulator to your resume. It can also serve as a talking point in either a cover letter or interview. You can address what you didn't know about the position before the simulator, and how it sharpened your knowledge of the job.



Time Management

A job simulator is a great task to complete during breaks or when you don't have the time available to commit to an internship or job. You can still gain experience without having to sacrifice other priorities, or if you just don't think you're ready to apply for positions yet. This is a great way to show an employer how you occupied your time!





Click on a project


Select a project to learn more about the details. You will read a description of the company and gain a better understanding of what the project will include.

<u>Can I receive extra credit for completing a job simulator?</u> NCC's Center for Career Development is in the process of working with faculty to allow completed job simulators to count towards extra credit. Be sure to check in with your instructor to see if extra credit can be granted.

<u>How do I update a complete simulator to my resume?</u> Forage provides guidance on how to update your resume upon completing a job simulator. <u>Are there job simulators for my major?</u> Unfortunately, there are not job simulators available for every major. Those studying business, computer science, and engineering will have the most success in finding a job simulator of interest. Be sure to check back frequently to see if this has changed. You can also reach out to the Experiential Learning/Internship Manager to see if there are opportunities not visible to you at this time.

<u>How can I use Forage if my major doesn't have a relevant job simulator?</u> Forage is still a great resource to continue building career readiness skills. There are projects on resume writing and interview skills. Both of these trainings provide useful tips throughout your career.

What if I'm not sure my major is what I really want to do for my career? You're in the right place! A job simulator is a small time commitment and is low risk. You can take just a few hours to explore a position and test out if it's right for you. If it's not, that's ok! There are other simulators to try out afterwards. We encourage you to schedule an appointment with our staff here at the Career Center if you still aren't having success in finding what interests you.
